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PURPOSE

This document is intended to supplement our current Safety Programs. The purpose of this plan is to provide additional safety practices at Shamrock Foods.

The provisions of this plan are mandatory. All employees will abide by this plan. All personnel who engage in fieldwork activities will be familiar with this plan and will comply with its requirements and our existing safety programs applicable to these sites. Employees and subcontractors will also sign an acknowledgment to this fact.

SITE DESCRIPTION AND SCOPE OF WORK

Our primary scope of work is buildings a cold storage distribution warehouse. The skeleton is erected from structural steel while the exterior walls are insulated metal panels. We will be completing site work with additional surrounds buildings such as a fuel station and truck maintenance building.

PROJECT TEAM ORGANIZATION

PROJECT SUPERINTENDENT

Our Project Superintendent has overall responsibility for the project, coordination and implementation and is the central point of contact with all regulatory agencies. Our Project Superintendent is responsible for implementing the steps of the site safety plan as well as our company's safety programs. He is also responsible for supervising the field team members and consulting with the work forces on site and the general contractors' personnel regarding any changes that may affect the health and safety of our employees. Superintendents/foremen responsible for coordinating the workday in a safe manner and to review with all employees this Site Safety Plan and the Company Safety programs and have them sign the acknowledgment forms verifying this.

AJP SAFETY COORDINATOR

Our safety coordinator is Brett Padelford and is responsible for of the site safety plan as well as our company's safety programs.

SITE FIELD EMPLOYEES

Field employees are responsible for reviewing, adhering to and understanding this Safety Plan. They are to be alert to any unsafe condition or practice that may affect their own safety or the safety of other workers. Serious safety deficiencies are to be communicated to the Project Superintendent or Safety Coordinator immediately. If any employee's safety is threatened by the activities of others, it is required that the Project Superintendent be contacted immediately.

SAFETY & HEALTH RISK ANALYSIS

We will provide for all our employees a protected and safe work environment by maintaining and implementing our written safety programs and site plan. Our company's goal is to comply with Arizona OSHA regulations. The safety of our employees is our paramount concern. It is mandatory that all employees, superintendents and subcontractors follow this plan. Only by working together can we achieve our goal of making this project as safe as possible.

- Any special training needed for any specific job will be supplied as required for all employees.
- All job sites present a degree of risk to project personnel. We do consider this project to have safety or health risks and will maintain awareness and reminders to our employees and subcontractors.
- We will use engineer practices to while working at this site. If engineering controls cannot be met, we will use personal protection equipment as needed.
- Sub-contractors will be working at this site and will be required to follow their safety programs and this site safety plan.

During routine operations, risk is minimized by establishing good working habits, practices, staying alert, engineer controls and using proper personal protective equipment. We will take the following steps to provide a safe and healthy work environment on this project. These steps are in addition to policies, procedures and regulations already in place.

Unpredictable events such as physical injury, hazardous material exposure, emergency evacuation or fire may occur and is anticipated. All our workers have participated First Aid and CPR courses as outlined in our safety programs. This enables them to effectively handle emergencies both physical and medical that may arise on the project.

The field trailer shall have the following items readily available:

1. Copies of the Site Safety Plan, SDS (Safety Data Sheets), company safety programs and emergency contact numbers
2. First Aid Kit
3. Drinking water
4. Fire extinguisher
5. Arizona OSHA, state posting requirements
6. Site map for closest medical facility
7. Site evacuation map and emergency procedures

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

EMERGENCY PLAN

Our trailer at this project will have the telephone numbers for the hospital or medical clinic nearest the site. There will be posted a map showing the most direct route to the hospital or medical center also. The Fire Department will be notified by the Project Superintendent regarding the type of work we will be doing and the duration of the job.

There will be made available in the trailer a telephone or a cellular telephone for all emergency phone calls. All employees should anticipate the effect of a major emergency on their project and plan a course of action that will minimize personal injury and property damage in the event of any fire, hazard or

natural disaster.

In case of an emergency our employees are instructed to dial 911 and provide them with the following:

TYPE OF EMERGENCY-

- FIRE -- Equipment, electrical, gas materials or structure
- INJURY -- Type of injury; fall, cut, pinned, crushed, buried, electrical shock or struck by object.
If the extent of injury is known tell them.
- ILLNESS -- Type of illness if known, dizziness, hyperventilating, heart attack, exposure to elements
- LOCATION -- Tell them where the person is located
- ADDRESS -- Give them the job address and the nearest cross streets or buildings

While the emergency response team is being notified, a First Aid/CPR certified person should be attending to the injured person(s).

After the emergency response team is notified, call the main office and inform them of the incident. Main Office 562-924-3364.

When help has arrived have all the people who witnessed the accident or incident provide the foreman/Project Superintendent with a written report or statement of what they saw, the facts should be in their own words.

Sub-contractors are required to have their own person designated to coordinate and implement their emergency plan in case of an accident.
